In June 2023, VCC officially opened the doors to the upgraded VCC Seiffert Market + Bakeshop. The Seiffert family and Snow Cap Enterprises maintained their strong support of VCC through a legacy gift of \$1M to continue the naming of the Seiffert Market + Bakeshop.

The VCC Seiffert Market + Bakeshop has been a community institution serving student-made pastries and baked goods for decades at the Downtown campus. The Seiffert family's donation has in part enabled the College to modernize the bakeshop with new equipment and move to a street level location accessible to community members.

The new bakeshop offers market items, local coffee, prepared food, and freshly baked goods created in VCC's Baking & Pastry Arts and Culinary Arts programs.

Honouring Dr. Peter Nunoda

In 2023, we were saddened to learn of the passing of Dr. Peter Nunoda, who served as VCC President and CEO from 2014 to 2019.

With over 30 years of academic leadership experience, some of the initiatives Dr. Nunoda was most proud of while at VCC were the College's 50th Anniversary campaign, We Built This City, and the implementation of the Gladue writing program. The first of its kind in Canada, VCC's Gladue Writing Certificate program prepares students to organize, write, and present Gladue Reports to assist the Canadian Judicial System in making well informed sentencing decisions with the goal of addressing over-incarceration of First Nations, Metis, Inuit, and Non-Status Peoples.

In honor of Dr. Nunoda's legacy, The Dr. Peter Nunoda Memorial Scholarship fund has been established in his name thanks to the generosity of his family, friends, and colleagues.

Many VCC students, who are supporting themselves and their families, struggle to make ends meet in an increasingly expensive region. From a 2023 survey, we found that:



Flourish Gala

Flourish presented by RBC is Vancouver Community College Foundation's annual gala.

The memorable "green tie" evening featured culinary creations by VCC alumni and some of Vancouver's leading chefs. Current VCC Culinary Arts students supported 15 food tasting stations and nine wine stations generously supported by Naramata Bench Wineries Association. Other sponsors included PCI Developments, Onni Group, Lowtide Properties, Dilawri Vancouver, Sodexo Live, BTY Group, Craftsman Collison and Color Compass Corp., and media partners BC Business and Drishti Magazine.

The gala was an impressive showcase of College programs and students. VCC alumni performed music and VCC Jewellery, VCC Digital Media Design, and VCC Fashion students presented merchandise and artisan jewellery. Virtual reality equipment and fully electric mechanical gear were on display courtesy of VCC Auto Collision and VCC Culinary Arts, while VCC's School of Health and Sciences highlighted fauna and flora native to the China Creek area, where our Broadway campus is located. Complimentary hand massages were given by VCC Esthetics students.

Flourish presented by RBC raised a record-breaking \$200,000 towards purchasing new virtual reality equipment, including haptic gloves, to increase opportunities for VCC students to practice hands-on training.

CCEAI

On display at Flourish was a model for the new Centre for Clean Energy and Automotive Innovation (CCEAI). The CCEAI building design draws upon the significance of a traditional Coast Salish canoe, the craft of canoe-making, and its relationship to land and water.

The CCEAI is also a catalyst project for VCC's **Campus Plan**; it will revitalize VCC's Broadway campus and act as the gateway to the neighbourhood's Cultural Ribbon located along Great Northern Way.

The CCEAI is the first step toward VCC's future. It will:

- Contribute 772 new full-time equivalent student spaces annually to meet the demand for 24,000+ jobs through to 2031
- House the new VCC School of Trades, Technology, and Design
- Provide students with HyFlex lab spaces and state-of-the art classrooms with expanded virtual reality, lab resources, and simulation equipment
- Create a new automotive innovations space where students will learn electric vehicle service and maintenance
- · Offer five existing and seven new programs, covering clean energy, automotive innovation, technology, and design
- · Ready the next generation of students to excel in clean energy and tech economies

Funds raised at Flourish will advance innovative technology in CCEAI classrooms, including virtual reality, laboratory resources, and simulation equipment.
